To participate in this program, parents must have a child 0~16 years old and enrolled in Baltimore County Public Schools, the Judy Center of Baltimore County or Baltimore County Head Start. *No Class Cost – Grant Funded.

How to register:

- To register for any ESOL Family Literacy class, go to any of the locations listed above.
- Registrations are in person only.
- Arrive on time and expect to be there for 2-3 hours for registration and testing. Registration is on a first come-first served basis.
- Students must be at least 18 years of age and officially withdrawn from high school to enroll.
- To request an accommodation for a disability please call 443-840-3428. Please allow staff adequate time to arrange it before registration.
- Students with an F-1 or J-1 visa are not eligible for these grant funded* classes.
- All new students MUST take a test. Returning students may not have to test if they bring paperwork from previous classes. Test procedures are subject to change.
